



HENRY HERING MEMORIAL MEDAL

The Henry Hering Medal is awarded as the occasion warrants for outstanding collaboration of architect, owner and sculptor in the distinguished use of sculpture in an architectural project. The medal, designed by Albino Manca, was the result of a national competition in 1958 and officially accepted February 10, 1959.
